# Student Visa

# Part-Time Work

You can work part-time while studying in Ireland, subject to specific conditions outlined by immigration regulations. Here's what you need to know:

International students holding a valid Immigration Permission Stamp 2 are permitted to work up to **40 hours per week** only during designated periods: June, July, August, and September, as well as from 15th December to 15th January inclusive. During all other times of the year, students with Stamp 2 are limited to working up to **20 hours per week**. It's important to note that your permission to work will cease when your Stamp 2 expires.

If you're enrolled in a degree program, you are eligible for casual work if you meet the following criteria:

- Registered with the **Garda National Immigration Bureau (GNIB)**.
- Enrolled in a recognized program leading to a qualification acknowledged by the Minister for Education & Skills.
- Attending a full-time program of education at or above NFQ Level 7.
- Undertaking a minimum of 15 hours of daytime study per week.
- Receiving tuition between the hours of 8 am and 6 pm per week for a minimum of 25 weeks per annum.
- Enrolled in a program of at least one year's duration.

By fulfilling these requirements, you can engage in part-time work opportunities to supplement your income and gain valuable experience while pursuing your education in Ireland. It's essential to adhere to immigration regulations and stay informed about any updates or changes to the guidelines to ensure compliance throughout your studies.

# Post Study Opportunities

Ireland offers post-study work opportunities for international students through the Irish Third Level Graduate Scheme. Here's what you need to know:

**Irish Third Level Graduate Scheme:** Non-European third level graduates are eligible to remain in Ireland for up to 24 months upon the completion of their studies to seek full-time employment opportunities.
